ECLIPSES.

There will be this year two Eclipses of the Moon and two of the Sun. The Eclipses of the Moon will be only partial, and will occur on the 9th April and the 3rd October. Only the first will be visible at Quebec; the commencement at 7h. 45m. in the evening, the middle of the Eclipse at 9h. 12m., and the end at 10h. 38m. Duration, 2h. 53m. Digits eclipsed, 7.2.
The two Eclipses of the Sun will occur on the 25th March and on the 18th September. The first will be total, but invisible at Quebec. The second will be central and annular, and will be visible as follows:—Beginning of Eclipse, 3h. 21m. afternoon, middle, 4h. 40m., end, 5h. 51m. Duration, 2h. 30m. Digits eclipsed, 10.5.
