If it should be asked what General Shirley, and the 3,000 Men under his Command were doing during the Summer, it can only be answered, that, after having built two small Forts at Oswego, he retired in Winter-Quarters.

The Miseries that succeeded this ineffectual Campaign might have been
expected, but they were indeed terrible: the unhappy Backsettlers experienced all the Distress that human Nature can suffer, whether in the Loss
of Circumstances, or the Loss of
Life!
