- " pure religion our enemies are undermining,
- " for your glory, which can only be ad-
- " vanced by rendering your people happy,
- " &c. &c.
- "That your royal authority and inter-
- " position may be used for our relief, and
- " that a gracious answer may be given to
- " this petition."

This petition was allowed to be moderate and reasonable, and was laid before Parliament by Lord Dartmouth, with many other papers that year.

The New-York Memorial to the House of Lords, of the 25th of March, 1775, says, "We shall always chearfully submit

- " to the constitutional exercise of the su-" preme regulating power lodged in King,
- " Lords, and Commons of Great Britain;
- " and to all acts calculated for the general
- " weal of the empire, and the due regula-
- " tion of the trade and commerce thereof,
