that deceit, corruption, or violence, can become a measure of State Policy. In a real Republic, which is Res Populi, the Procession of its constitution, and the course of its actions, arise from Nature and Truth; all Deception, all Corrupt influence, all Violence, is directly contrary to the true principles of politics. Without Truth and Justice, a Republic cannot be administered or governed. The Supream Magistrate of such a free State, must, from the nature of his information, fee things as they lie in Nature, and will of Course found his Measures in Truth. Truth is not only a virtue, but is Wisdom; and, in a government of a real Republic, such as the Empire of America, is the only Genuine Policy. It creates trust, finds Union and Confidence. And, laftly, an Administration actuated by such principles and maxims, finds itself Cloathea with Strongen, the united strength of the Peo-
