ANOTHER PROJECTED LINE TO HUDSON BAY

Alberta Central Seeking to Construct From Saskatoon to Fort Churchill and Fort Nelson.

OTTAWA, Nov. 10.—(Special).—The Alberta Central Railway Co. has entered into the field as one of the competitors for the construction of a line of railway to Hudson Bay, and through its solicitors, Smith & Johnston, Ottawa, has given notice of application to parliament for an act with power, among other things, "to enter into agreement with his majesty King George V., as represented by the governor in council for Canada, or the minister of railways and canals, or other lines of railway companies, to construct, operate, etc., a line of railway in common, or as may be defined by the proposed act from Saskatoon eastward to Hudson Bay, with terminal at both Fort Churchill and Fort Nelson."

QUEBEC FINANCES IN PROSPEROUS STATE

Decrease of Over Twenty-four Millions in Funded Debt of the Province.

MONTREAL, Nov. 10.—(Special).—Hon. P. S. G. MacKenzie, provincial treasurer, was tendered a non-political banquet this evening at Richmond. The treasurer stated that the outstanding funded debt of the province, including capital for conversion, amounted to \$24,696,216, a decrease of nearly ten millions over former days.

He said the Province of Quebec had spent \$17,000,000 adding the construction of railways, while the annual expenditure on the road and bridge service amounts to \$250,000.
