WERE NOT DUITE SURE ABOUT BRYAN'S TITLE

Hamilton Reception Committee, in Doubt, Had To Consult a Reporter.

HAMILTON, May 12 .- (Special.)-Arrangements for entertaining Wil-liam Jennings Bryan when he arrives here to-morrow were made to-night by the legislation and reception com-mittee of the city council. Some doubt existed as to whether the title of "honorable" was applicable to the dis-tinguished American, but after consultation with one of the local reporters it was decided to give Mr. Bryan the benefit of the doubt, and his name went down in the minutes as Hon. Wm. J. Bryan. On his arrival at the Grand Trunk station at 2.09 to-mor-row afternoon Mr. Bryan will be met by Mayor Lees, Alfred Powis, president of the local Y.M.C.A., under the auspices of which institution Mr. Bryan comes to Hamilton; T. F. Best, secretary of the Y.M.C.A.; Controller. Bailey, Chairman Davey, and the other members of the council committee. hTe party will then go for an auto drive around the city, and at 6 o'clock luncheon will be served in honor of the silver-tongued advocate of 16 to 1 doctrone. At 8 o'clock Mr. Bryan will deliver his famous lecture, "The Prince of Peace," at Association Hall, and on Sunday afternoon at. the same place he will address a meeting of men only.

The committee also busied itself tonight with arrangements of the coronation celebration. Chairman Ald. Davey outlined what had been done. and said that efforts would be made to have the separate school children-march in the parade. Ald. 
