Advances at Chicago and Liverpool

Markets in Line-Oats and Peas Easier - Cheese Improved - Big Decrease in World's Visible Wheat Supply-Gossip.

Tuesday Evening, June 21. The Chicago wheat market was again irregular to-day. Shortly after the opening there was a oreak, amounting to nearly a cent per bushel, but on covering by shorts the cereal became strong, and all deliveries advanced. At the close June wheat showed a gain of 2¢ over yesterday's final quotation, July a gain of 2½c, September one of 1½c, and December one of 1½c. The big decrease in the world's visible supply and reports of damage to Western crop were factors which influenced the situation and led shorts to cover.

Other American markets advanced cor-respondingly. At Toronto some trades went through on a basis of 80c for red win-ter and \$1.05 for No. 1 Manitoba hard on

British wheat markets showed an improvement to-day. All future deliveries advanced, July closing 2½d higher than yesterday, September 1½d higher and December 1d higher, Spot wheat at the same time declined 4d to 6d per cental. At Paris wheat rose 60 to 85 centimes for the day, Antwerp markets remained unchanged. In Chicago to-day corn falled to accompany wheat and ruled rather weaker than yesterday,
