IMPROVED TONE IN WHEAT.

Futures Manifested a Tendency to Advance Yesterday.

Cables Were Higher and Paris Market Rallied a Little - Corn Markets Also Recovered Somewhat - Local Grain, Produce and Live Stock - Notes and Gossip.

Tuesday Evening, March 21. Liverpool wheat futures to-day closed 1/4 to 1/2 cent higher than yesterday's final figures.

Chicago wheat futures advanced 1/4 cent to-day, and retained the gain.

Liverpool maize advanced 1/4 to 1/2 cent to-day, and retained the gain.

Flour declined 1/4 at Liverpool to-day.

Wheat receipts at Liverpool the past three days 100,000 cwt., including 60,000 of American; corn the same time 10,000 cwt., all American.

Exports at New York to-day: Flour 65 barrels and 500 sacks; wheat none.

Stocks of flour and wheat in France on March 1 were 1,840,000 bushels, against 5,740,000 bushels on Aug. 1, and 6,300,000 bushels on March 1, 1908.

Receipts of wheat at Minneapolis and Duluth to-day 363 cars, as against 2.0 cars the corresponding day of last year.

THE CATTLE MARKETS.

Prices Up Again in London and Liverpool.

Montreal, March 21.—(Special.)—Short supplies on the British market forced prices up again to a high level.

Chicago Live Stock Market. Chicago, March 21.—(Special.)—The market for live stock to-day was easily disposed of.

There was a good local and shipping demand for hogs to-day, and the market was fully recovered.

New York Live Stock. New York, March 21.—(Special.)—Receipts 1400; none for sale; feeling steady, cables 1500; market for hogs to-day was easily disposed of.

East Buffalo Cattle Market. East Buffalo, N. Y., March 21.—(Special.)—There were no fresh arrivals to-day.

Local Live Stock. The run of live stock at the cattle market to-day was large, 72 car loads, composed of 180 cattle, 225 sheep and yearling lambs, 1500 hogs, and 50 calves.

Quality of fat cattle generally fair; some few extra choice Easter animals being offered.

Trade generally good. Business did not drag as on Friday, most of the stock of the kind being sold by noon.

Prices for the best grades of exporters were about 10c per cwt. firmer, but generally Friday's prices were well maintained.

Export cattle—Choice loads of heavy exporters sold at \$4.15 to \$5; and light, \$3.75 to \$4.25; and medium, \$3.50 to \$4.00.

Butchers' cattle—Choice picked lots of butchers' cattle, equal in quality to the best export, sold at \$3.75 to \$4.25.

Loads of good butchers' and exporters' milk cows, sold at \$3.50 to \$4.00.
