FAILED TO SWIM CHANNEL.
Wolfe, Amateur, Makes His Third Attempt—Hampered by Injured Leg.

London, July 23.—J. Wolfe, the amateur swimmer, made another vain attempt to swim the English Channel today. He started at 10:30 o'clock this morning, entering the sea under the South Foreland lighthouse.

An old injury to his leg compelled him to abandon the attempt after swimming more than 21 miles.

Wolfe tried to swim the Channel on July 18 of last year, but had to abandon the task when he had swum eleven hours and had reached a point within seven miles of the French coast. He made another attempt on July 30 and swam all night, but had to give up again.
