WALL STREET REVIEW.

New York, Nov. 2.—Further readjustment of values from a war to a peace basis was the outstanding feature of the week in the securities market, the transition being attended with some unsettlement.

The declining tendency in industrial war shares as a whole derived additional momentum from the reduction of the United States Steel's extra dividend from 3 to 2 per cent, a condition due not so much to decreased earnings as to the enormous appropriations required to meet federal taxes and excess profits. Trading was attended by less activity, the outcome of restrictions upon loans recommended by the local money committee, but this barrier was overcome to a degree later in the week when call loans fell to 4 per cent, the lowest rate in three months.

The effect of the money committee's suggestion, that the flaancial institu-

tions advance their margins on loans from 20 to 30 per cent, and which becomes operative next week, is already apparent in a heavy contraction of brokers loans. This was made possible by the closing out of many speculative accounts, especially in stocks of non-investment character. Accompanying this movement was an inquiry instituted by the officials of the stock exchange to minimize activity in stocks controlled by pools.

With the approach of peace leading financial interests are giving much thought to business, which at the moment shows much hesitation, mainly in relation to the question of labor.

New York, Nov. 2-Wall Street, 10:10 .m.-Stocks were irregular at the opening of today's market, further selling of oils forcing other active issues to lower levels. Shippings were easy, but rails and steels yielded fractionally.

New York, Nov. 2. - Further selling of speculative issues, notably oils, unsettled the market again in the early part of today's short session.

Mexican Petroleum dropped ten points and Royal Dutch nine, United States Steel fell to its lowest quotation in many weeks, together with war shares, and rails and metals lost one to two points, while shippings, motors, tobaccos and sugars fell one to four. Only a few of these recessions were regained in the short covering of the final dealings. The closing was irregular. Sales approximated 400,000 shares.

10:30 a.m.—Mexican Petroleum's further decline of 10 points and United States Steel's recession of 1% to the lowest quotation of the current movement, were the noteworthy features of the early trading. Losses of one to two points also occurred in such active issues as Bethlehem Steel, Baldwin Locomotive, American Smelting, American Car, Studebaker, Industrial Alcohol, and fractional gains in coal shares were offset by moderate reactions in Pacifics. of speculative issues, notably oils, un-
