## UNIONISTS HAVE AGAIN AVOIDED DEFINITE SPLIT

Consolidation of Party With Organization and Platform Is Shelled.

### SAME OLD PLATFORM

That of Notorious 1917 Election To Do Duty in Coming By-Election.

(Special to The Advertiser.)

OTTAWA, Oct. 2.—The danger of a split in the Unionist ranks has again been avoided for another session. The much heralded proposal for the immediate consolidation of the party, with platform and organization, has been shelved until next spring, when the House meets again. The "party" will remain in the meantime in its present uncohesive form. The platform for the coming by-elections will be the platform of the notorious election of 1917. The organization will be the shattered remnants of that which was used on the same occasion.

Sir Robert Borden came to the caucus as announced, and was given an ovation. Donald Sutherland of Oxford almost broke up the meeting early in the proceedings by declaring in his deep bass voice that "there were traitors in the camp." "There are men here," he said with conviction "who have come to spy and listen, but for no other purpose." Members looked nervously at their neighbors, but the traitors could not be identified, and Mr. Sutherland's protest was drowned in cries of disapproval. Otherwise the gathering was something of a jog-along love feast.

Sir Robert's announcement as contained in the statement given out afterwards must have been a somewhat dry affair. He dwelt long upon the platform of 1917, and declared that no government had ever implemented its pre-election promises as this Government had. (Loud cheers.)

In General Terms. He thereupon laid down in very general terms the policy of the Government for the future on the prominent issues of the day. He did not ask the gathering to pronounce upon these immediately; in fact the premier's health is not in a condition to permit him to endure controversial debate, and he was very tired after the ordeal which he was compelled to go through.

He informed his followers that the question of the permanency of the party would be postponed until next session, when members would have had an opportunity of digesting the proposals submitted, and when a caucus would be held at which the whole matter would be threshed out. He put some comfort into the hearts of his followers in the meantime by declaring that under normal conditions there would be no general election until 1922, after the decennial census and redistribution of federal constituencies.

The premier will leave immediately for Virginia.

OFFICIAL STATEMENT. OTTAWA, Oct. 2.—The following official statement covering the proceedings at the Unionist caucus today was given out tonight. It is as follows:

Mr. Hume Cronyn presided over a caucus of Government supporters this morning, at which there was a very full attendance. The proceedings were characterized by great earnestness and unanimity. Sir Robert Borden addressed the caucus for about an hour, and pointed out in the first place the platform, consisting of twelve articles, which was submitted to the people of Canada on October 18, 1917, and upon which the Government received its mandate from the people. He emphasized the fact that in the policy only the vigorous prosecution of the war, but many other important subjects. Among them were civil service reform and the abolition of patronage, the extensions of the franchise to women, adequate taxation of war profits, effective arrangements for demobilization, the care and vocational training of returned soldiers, for assistance in enabling them to settle upon the land, and for adequate pensions. Besides this, the policy had included the development of transportation facilities, co-operative management of the various systems, the encouragement and development of shipbuilding, and the investigation of the possibilities of air service. It also embraced effective measures to prevent excessive profits, and it included the general development of the varied resources of Canada, their conservation, and utilization for the advantage of the people, adequate consideration of the needs of

ROME, Oct. 2.—The Italian steamer Epiro, with 200 Italian troops and some American officers on board, bound for Cattaro, is declared in a dispatch from Bari to the Tempo to have been shot at by Jugo-Slav regular troops in the channel between Roudoni Island and the Arsa Promontory. One Italian was wounded. The Epiro, the dispatch added, made off at full speed and escaped further attack.



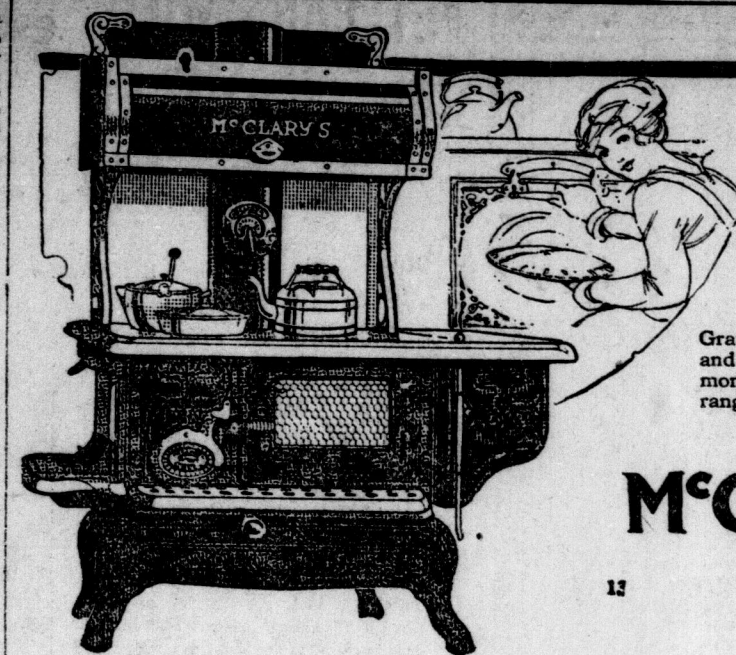

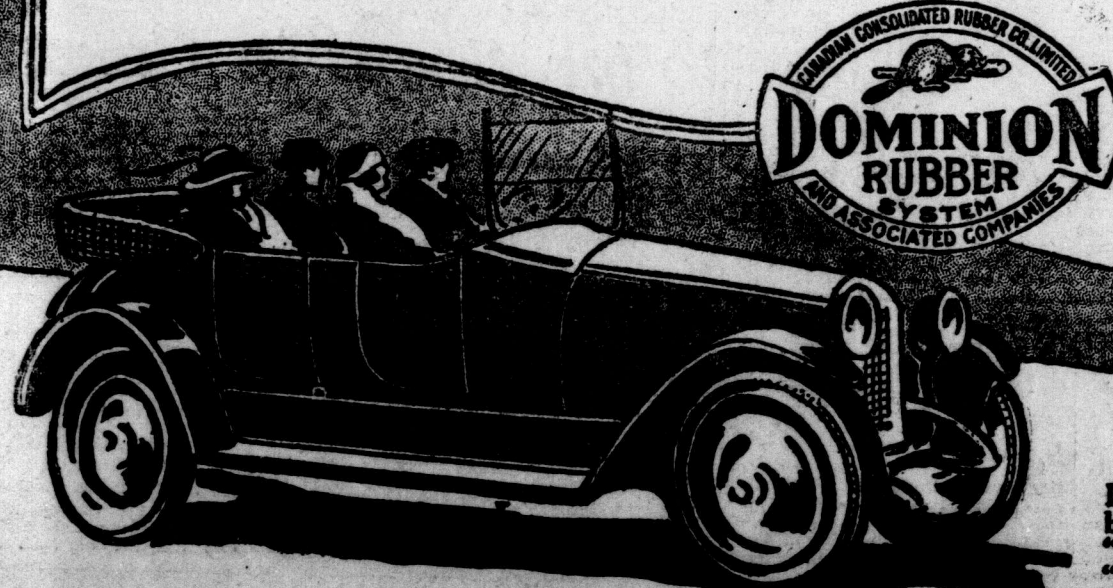
