# MINERS DECIDE TO ISSUE STRIKE NOTICE,

LONDON, Sept. 2.—With only a half hours' discussion, the miners' delegates today unanimously decided to issue strike notices, and tonight to issue strike notices, and tonight there is not yet any sign of either side in the dispute making an approach to the other. The Government appears confident that it has the nation at its back.
