VARIETIES.

Appeal to the Privy Council for permission to bury or burn Hindoo Widows alive.—The British public will learn with amazement, scarcely less than indignation a knowledge of the fact most execrable, that an English lawyer has come to this country from India to prosecute an appeal before the Privy Council made by a few Brahmins in Bengal against Lord William Bentinck's prohibition of suttee. This diabolical custom had its origin in the excessive jealousy of the early Hindoo Princes, who, with a view to prevent their numerous widows forming subsequent attachments, availed themselves of their irresponsible power, and with the aid of the priests it was promulgated as if by sacred authority that the wives of the Hindoos of every cast, who desired future beauties, should immolate themselves on the demise of their husbands. Since 1756, when the British power in India became firmly established, upwards of seventy thousand widows have been cruelly massacred. A Brahmin possesses the privilege of marrying as many wives as he pleases. Unwittingly, a Brahmin, who died at Baghapat, had more than one hundred wives—twenty two were burned at his death. The fire was kept burning three days. He had married four sisters, two of whom were burned with his corpse. A short time before Lord Bentinck's order, a Rajah, in the hill country, who died, had twenty-eight wives burned with his body. The lawyer, now in London, to plead before the Privy Council for the restoration of these abominations, was in Calcutta in December, 1829, when Lord Bentinck vindicated humanity by the abolition of such strange, foul, and unnumbered murders, and knows the God-like act was hailed with enthusiasm by millions of the Hindoos—that a deputation to express their heartfelt satisfaction, and that the whole of the Sepoy army were enraptured at the act. The appeal is now set down for hearing before the Privy Council.—East India Magazine.

BACCHANALIAN PROPENSITIES OF THE WEST INDIANS.—Of a variety I do believe that the inhabitants of these far islands would be like Falstaff, if they were musical, and prefer playing on the sackbut to any other instrument. I judge thus from the experience with which they play on their pipes of Port and Madeira, from the mastery manner in which they dispatch their bottles of champagne, and from the facility with which they discuss their jorums of saugaree. This last beverage is a universal favourite; the indefatigable planter, the pleading barrister, the deciding clerk, the attentive merchant, and the laborious clerk, all agree in the necessity of taking their quantum of this mixture with their second breakfast. Jovial reader, upon the authority of one who has tasted it, I can assert that it is a right blessed drink in a warm country, and in case thou wouldst like to try it in one that is somewhat foggy to boot, I will give thee a recipe in due form. Let the first half be water; let the second half be wine; and let the other two halves, as Paddy said of the apple that was cut in four, be of sugar and nutmeg, then stir them together, and thou wilt have a beverage fit for an author, and therefore fit for a prince. The tamarind and sorrel drinks, too, are very refreshing, as is also the lemonade, for which the juice of lemons is used more often than that of the lemon itself, they being far more plentiful in Barbados. Then there is the "creme de noyau" and the amaretto, and the champagne, white and red, forming like the salt spray of the Atlantic, and sparkling as the diamond of the east.—These come from Martinique, and are of a price proportionate to their quality.—Bayly's description of Barbados.

TRAINING OF HORSES.—The emperor was not a graceful rider; his seat on horseback was by no means firm, but the care with which his horses were broken rendered his deficiency in this respect of less consequence. The horses destined for Napoleon's personal use were forced to undergo a rough novitiate before they were suffered to enjoy the distinction of carrying their imperial master. They were trained to remain perfectly steady under tortures of every description; to receive blows about the head; drums were beat pistols and crackers fired in their ears; flags and sometimes even sheep and pigs were thrown between their legs. None of the animals were deemed sufficiently trained, till the emperor could, without the least difficulty, pull them up short at full gallop, which was his favourite pace.—Constant's Memoirs of Buonaparte.
