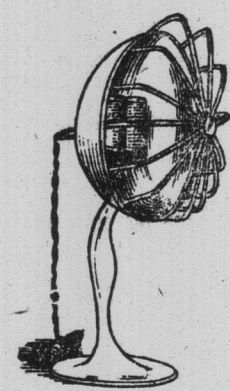

BOWLING NOT A
GAME OF LUCK

World's Champion Talks To
Times Readers

ARCHIE WALSH
INTERVIEWED

Something of St. John Boy's Career
on The Alleys, Where He Has
Won Phenomenal Success—
Accuracy And Confidence Es-
sentials in The Game

"Bowling is practically the winter sport of the United States and is making deep inroads into the winter games of Canada," said Archie Walsh, champion candle pin bowler, in the course of an interview with a Times reporter. He is at present in the city spending a few

weeks in his home town. Through the instigation of George Magee, manager of the Y.M.C.I. bowling alleys in Cliff street, Walsh decided to pay a visit to St. John and will give an exhibition at the Y.M.C.I.

In conversation with a reporter, Mr. Walsh discussed the bowling game, spoke modestly of his own success in it and finally referred to what he thought was necessary for Canadians to be on a par with Americans on the alleys. "I began the game very young," he said. "At the age of sixteen I took a liking to it and became known as the 'Boy Wonder' throughout New England. Even today I have difficulty in making people believe I am twenty-seven and the youthful epithet of 'Boy Wonder' sticks to me yet."

Gradually, Walsh's fame as a bowler spread throughout the United States, and as far as Washington. From the early age of sixteen up to the present day Walsh has been steadily winning, and in that period of eleven years, he has established records that today stand, has been on winning teams that have made records galore and has probably participated in more games than any other bowler in the game.

Asked what were the essentials of a champion bowler, Walsh remarked that "accuracy and confidence were the two great assets. Accuracy is the greatest of all, followed closely by confidence. Confidence in my own ability to win," he said, "has played a great part in the success that I have attained in the bowling game."

"A bowler must have a natural born ability for the game or he can never be a champion or make a real mark at bowling," he added. "Luck has nothing to do with a champion. Luck does not count in the persistent game of bowling."

ing were a few of his statements.

"Statistics of leagues and of individual bowlers will prove that luck does not play a material value in the game. In the last three years in the league in which I have rolled, the average total pin fall from every ten year would not vary seventy-five pins. The top-notchers are always on top, until these days is over. In the Boston City League within the last few years the average has been between 106 and 108, thus showing you that luck is not essential and counts for practically nothing in the game for a persistent bowler."

"How about practice?" asked the reporter.

"Well," replied Walsh, "when I found out that I could bowl, practice never counted. I have got away from the game in May and gone up to camp on the St. John river for the summer and returned in September to Boston and after rolling three or four balls I would

go right into a ten string match game and score just as high scores as ever."

For a bowler who rolls consistently the velocity of ninety or over Walsh thinks practice does not make him any better.

In reply to a question the champion said that "the advantages of a slow ball and a speedy ball are about even. The bowler who uses a slow ball has the advantage of the dead wood that is naturally left from his first or second ball, whereas the speedy artist has the advantage of the rebound and getting the end pins from the side bumpers."

Speaking of the game itself, Walsh admitted that it was "tiresome when one follows it as closely as I have done."

The game is an old game, he said, but the introduction of candle pins some twenty-five years ago has reconstructed it very much.

"Today it might be called the chief winter sport of the United States and the interest is yearly being augmented in Canada."

Walsh said that "with a few new ideas in this city you can boast of more actual champion bowlers than you do, and here he bowed gracefully to the reporter."

"By ideas I mean that you here in St. John, where there are some very fine bowlers, should develop more interest in the two-men-team. It is much easier to pick two good bowlers than it is to pick five good bowlers," concluded Walsh. He said the two-men team will be the big thing in U. S. A. next year.

Passing to his own records and accomplishments in the game, Walsh said that in 1912 he was a member of the famous Chelsea Square team, whose records of a five-men team stand today and are open to inspection. Their grand total of 1747 has never been equaled and their single string record of 647 still holds the record.

Personally Walsh holds the record for ten consecutive strings, having 1244. This record was made in competition at Portsmouth, N.H. Last year Walsh finished with an average of 113 for the season as a member of a team in the Boston Suburban League. This is the highest average that any bowler ever had in any candle pin league. Walsh bowled in more than 75 per cent of the games. The nearest to this record was made by Paul Pochler, who bowled 111 in the Boston City League.

Last year Walsh was one of the star bowlers at the Atlantic Coast Bowling Association's annual tournament and was a member of the Chauncy team which won the championship at the meet in Washington against a field of more than 120 teams.

The famous Pochler-Walsh (two men team) have never been defeated and they have bowled all the way from St. John, throughout New England and as far as Washington for the last six years.

"We have yet to meet defeat in a ten string match game," said Walsh.

Walsh's highest single string is 175, which at one time was the world's record. Today it is claimed by John Wentzell of Salem, Mass., who bowled 181 in one string.

Walsh holds the highest single string ever made in the Boston City League, having made 175. This has never been equaled.

Walsh said that he never drank, smoked or touched tobacco in any shape or form. He admitted he did not do that to keep in training, but Walsh weighs today 122 pounds and stands about five feet three and one-half inches. "One's
