The escape of Captain Kinred provides one of the most remarkable stories of the war. He saw a bomb coming over his trench and drop near seven sleeping men. "In a moment," he writes, "I saw the danger they were in and no time could be lost in picking it up, so I decided to smother it by lying on it. No sooner had I laid on it than it exploded, blowing me from the corner of the trench at an angle of 303 degrees on its top and I was wearing a steel waistcoat. ## SAYS ALLIES EXPECT A YEAR MORE OF WAR

Paul D. Cravath, Confident of Germany's Doom

Sudden Peace a Myth—Attorney Found England and France Determined To Continue Until Prussianism is Crushed

(New York Times.)

Paul D. Cravath, a corporation lawyer, returned last night on the American liner Koonham after a two months' trip to France, where he visited the Somme and Verdun fronts. He said the official figures regarding the aerial fighting gave the Germans as losing 120 machines and the Allies sixty during the month of August. It was evident, he said, that the Allies were preparing for at least another year of war, if not longer.

The question of how long Germany can hold out will be decided when her government realizes that it is going to lose, he said. When asked by a Times reporter for his opinion of the conditions in the war as seen from his own observations, Mr. Cravath said:

"My observations, superficial as they necessarily are, lead me to believe that the magnitude of the achievements of the French and English nations in this war and of the issues at stake, not only for them, but for us in America, I return home with all doubts removed as to the ultimate certainty in this regard, and I am told that the same opinion has become general in neutral countries in Europe, even in those having pro-Teutonic sympathies.

"It now seems to me as certain as human affairs can be that the German armies that lost the battle of the Marne two years ago to greatly inferior forces, when every advantage was in their favor, cannot now win when superior and highly organized forces are facing them on every front.

"The question which is on every lip is: How long will the war last? The men who are in best position to say do not hazard an opinion except to its minimum duration. I am convinced that one element is wholly eliminated, and that is


However, Mr. Montaux went on to say that while music of a dead German is all right, the compositions of a living Teuton can never be recognized by a loyal Frenchman.
