MATERNAL MORTALITY SHOWS AN INCREASE

Washington, Oct. 18. - Maternal nortality is increasing and no progres is being made toward its reduction deis being made toward its reduction despite extensive research and development of modern methods, Dr. W. T. Bell of Toronto, pediatrician to the maternal and child welfare bureau of the Ontario Provincial Board of Health, told the delegates attending the annual convention of the National Child Hygiene Association. Much work remains to be done before the maternal death rate will be lowered, he declared, expressing the belief that a large percentage of this mortality is preventable. He added that health education through the public nurse, recently inaugurated in Ontario, was expected to aid greatly in reducing the maternal death rate.


