

Montreal, Nov. 18—Two nervy bandits made a daring but unsuccessful attempt to hold up the teller of the Sterling Bank in St. James street this morning. The bank was crowded with customers at the time. One of the bandits handed the teller a note on which was written:

"Hand me over \$10,000 in \$10 notes. Don't move and don't speak."

The teller made believe to be getting the money, but drew a revolver. A customer waiting to cash a check guessed what was going on and jumped on one of the men.
