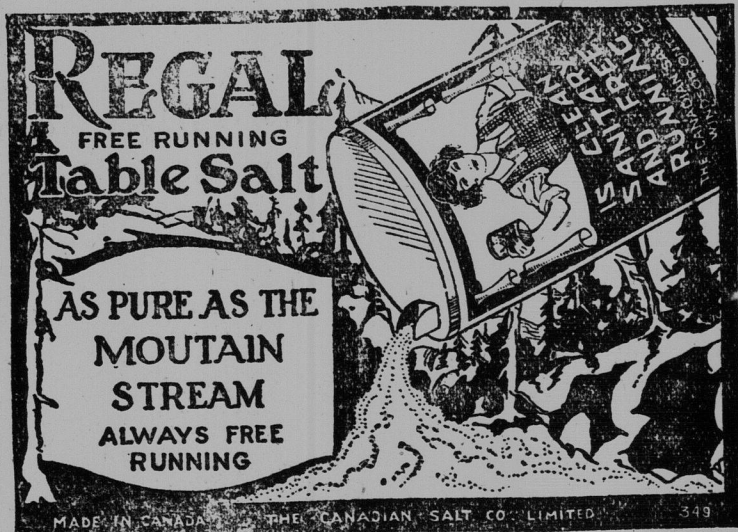


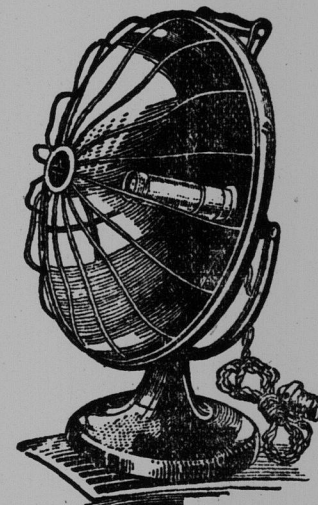


Fire Prevention.
The governor-general, Baron Byng of Vimy has proclaimed the week commencing Sunday, October 9, and ending Saturday, October 15, as Fire Prevention Week throughout Canada. The following is an extract from the proclamation: "Boy Scout leaders give instructions to the troops under their control as to the best means of co-operating with municipal fire departments in the prevention and extinguishment of fires and especially as to the desirability of qualifying for the fireman's badge."
