### EVIDENCE ABOUT GASOLINE SALES

Some Differences in Dates on Copies of Receipts.

Nichols Denies They Were Made by Him—Counsel in Tilts at the Trial of John Paris This Morning.

The entire morning session of the Paris trial today was taken up with evidence relating to the sale of gasoline by the prisoner and by the Imperial Oil Company to Stanley Nichols. The cross-examination of Nichols was continued on the opening of the court and was not completed after noon, the questions being chiefly in connection with quantities of gasoline purchased during July and August of last year and the matter of dates. He was followed by Wilson Robinson, driver of the company's wagon, who was still on the stand at adjournment. There were more tilts by counsel for crown and defence.

#### HALF HOLIDAY.

#### INSPECTION TRIP.

#### MILFORD FIRE.

The residents of Fairville experienced another scare this morning. Smoke was seen issuing from a dwelling house owned by James Goldie, in Milford, just across the railway tracks. An alarm was given in Fairville, and the department responded. They found a blaze near the chimney and checked it.

#### TWO NOW IN POUND.

Since the city dog pound was opened eight canines have been rounded up. Four of these were reclaimed by their owners, two uncalled for were sold and two still remain in captivity. One of these is a black and white spaniel and the other a brown and white collie.
