

OF FOOD TAKES DROP

Onions, Potatoes, Eggs, and Other Staples Approach Pre-War Level. (New York Evening Post.)

The return to pre-war wholesale prices of four vegetables and a general downward trend in practically all foodstuffs lend credence to the prediction of a number of marketmen made yesterday that retail prices in New York would soon be back to their former figures.

The four vegetables which are back to before-the-war wholesale prices are onions at 75 cents a hundred pounds, potatoes at from \$2.25 to \$2.50 a barrel of 180 pounds, cabbages, and carrots. Potatoes are now selling retail at a number of chain stores at five pounds for tencents the lowest they have been for some time.

Eggs dropped four cents a dozen in all grades yesterday, reducing the best grade near-by hennery eggs to thirty-nine and forty cents a dozen. Chain stores sold brown eggs yesterday at forty-five cents, and white eggs at fifty-eight and fifty-nine cents a dozen.

Condensed milk and even meat cuts have also started downward in price.
