RECIPROCITY

Shows Canada's Good Bargain—Knox Denounces Annexation Talk as Silly

Ottawa, Feb. 19.—That Canada has secured a good bargain in the reciprocity agreement with the United States and that it will stimulate rather than check the investment of British capital in the Dominion, is the opinion of A. M. Grenfell, son-in-law of Earl Grey, member of the banking firm in Chicago, Milne, Grenfell & Co. and chairman of the Canadian agency of one of the leading Canadian bond issues here in London, which reached here today.

In a called message which reached here today, Mr. Grenfell is quoted as giving the following interview to a representative.

"The future prosperity of Canada must be largely based on the soundness of its agricultural industry and the enhanced value of western farm lands that will result from reciprocity will mean greater security to English investors. The free and larger markets which reciprocity will open for the farmers of the west will cause greater demands for the products of the factories of the east."

"Canadian statesmen have taken advantage of the situation. It appears to me that they have secured splendid terms for Canada in exchange for giving Americans what Americans could have taken for themselves at any time by simply lowering their tariff wall without asking permission from Canada."

LAUNCHING OF ANOTHER GOULD TO WED SOON

THE THUNDERER
New Battleship for Britain Bears Name Famous in Empire's Naval Warfare—She is Fifth

The Thunderer, the first vessel of the dreadnought type to be built in the Thames, has just found a place in the largest battleship fleet.

The main dimensions of the Thunderer are: Overall length 284 feet, beam 32 feet 6 inches, draft 27 feet and displacement when completed, 22,680 tons. Her main armament will consist of five pairs of 15.5 inch guns of 45 caliber, which will all be placed on the center line of the vessel. The two forward turrets firing right ahead, and the aftermost right astern. In each case the second turret is being placed in such a manner as to fire over the top of the turret in front of it. The fifth turret will be placed amidships, between the two forward turrets.

The secondary armament will consist of 24 4-inch guns, and three torpedo tubes of the 18-inch type will be fitted. The shaft horsepower of the turbine engines will be 27,000 giving a speed of 27 knots on trial.

The Thunderer will be introduced to society nearly three years ago and soon afterward went to Paris with her mother and her stepfather, Hubert Vos, where they spent a year. It was while in Paris that she met Mr. Gould and the mutual attachment began there.

Miss Graham is an attractive young woman and devoted to outdoor sports. Her education was acquired largely in Europe and she is accomplished in languages. Her mother comes of one of the oldest Italian families, some of whom reigned over the Sandwich Islands long before that dynasty came to civil life after the annexation of the islands to the United States. Mrs. Vos came to New York as a bride on her first voyage, and has lived here most of the time since. Her marriage to Mr. Vos, a Dutch painter of note, was celebrated here about fifteen years ago.

Mr. and Mrs. Vos formerly had one of the finest studios in the Bryant Park Studio Building, leaving there in the recently constructed co-operative buildings now in vogue with painters. In the studio are many portraits painted by Mr. Vos, notably one of the Empress of China, which he did some years ago in China.

Jay Gould has an international reputation gained by his victories at tennis. He is the finest tennis player in the world, his career in that sport having begun while a student at Columbia. His successful playing in England some years ago against the crack players there made him the talk of the athletic world. He has shown on many occasions his skill in polo, both he and his elder brother, Kingston Gould, having played polo since they were boys.

No definite plans have been made for the wedding beyond selecting the date and the place. Mr. Gould and his bride will go to Europe soon after their marriage, and will, while in London, visit Lord and Lady Desborough.

PHYTHIAS AT DIVINE SERVICE IN CENTENARY CHURCH ON SUNDAY

Standing room was at a premium in Centenary church yesterday afternoon when the Knights of Pythias observed the 40th anniversary of their order by attending Divine worship. The members of the order completely filled the lower portion of the church, and many were compelled to stand during the entire service. Rev. Geo. Bamblary, Kenneth Bommel and Edwin Bommel sang Saviour of the World, Gaudium Promissae, Hayley.

Dr. Arnold Fox presided at the organ and an excellent choir of more than sixty five selected voices sang Art Thou Weary, with great effect, as well as leading in the congregational singing. A Chipp Ritchie was in charge of the singing. A male quartette consisting of Sydney C. Young, Wm. Bamblary, Kenneth Bommel and Edwin Bommel sang Saviour of the World, Gaudium Promissae, Hayley.

The service throughout was very impressive. Rev. Mr. Marr based his discourse on the words: Ye Are My Friends if Ye Do What I Have Commanded You. The preacher first pointed out the gradations of the relationship that existed between Christ and His disciples before he called them friends. The word friend, if rightly understood, meant more than brother. David had brothers and yet Jonathan loved him more truly than any of them. The order of the Knights of Pythias had its rise in the philosophy of Pythagoras, who lived many centuries before the birth of Christ. Both Damon and Pythias were disciples of that philosopher who taught that the highest duty of man was to speak the truth and confer benefits on another.

Damon had been condemned to death, and Pythias at his own request was held as a hostage for his friend. The way home to arrange his affairs. In the year 1864 Pythianism was revived in the United States at a time when the civil war was raging at its fiercest. The same was true of the philanthropist who amid the general suffering of his kind taught humanity and kindly feeling.

In conclusion, Rev. Mr. Marr urged the members of the Knights of Pythias to cultivate the friendship of Christ. The motto of the order was Friendship, Benevolence and Concord, and these were the qualities which should be the basis of these men's lives. "By the power of these men the world would be made better and men's minds broadened till all shall recognize the perfect brotherhood of man and the fatherhood of God."
