## Armistice Terms Changed in Some Of the Particulars

Washington, Nov. 12—Amendments of the armistice terms made by Marshal Foch after his first meeting with German plenjootentiaries as an nounced tonight by the state department include the delivery to the United States and Allies of all of Germany's submarines, instead of the 160 specified in the original armistice. Another a mendment specifies that "The countries on the left bank of the Rhine evacuated by the Germans shall be administered by the local authorities us not the control of the armies of occupation, instead of by the local authorities us not ignally provided, the amended terms specify that they shall be withdrawn as soon as the Allies, taking into consideration the internal situation of these territories, (of Russia) shall decide that the time for this has come."

MASSACRE OF 15,000 ARMENIANS BY THE TURKS REPORTED

Bagdad, Nov. 12—Reports have been received at the American consulate here, that 15,000 Armenians have been massacred at Tasu (Hasu) fifteen miles southwest of Bitlis, Asiatic Turkey.


