

Constitution and By-Laws.

ARTICLE I.—NAME.

SEC. 1. This Association shall be known as the Holstein-Friesian Breeders' Association of Canada.

ARTICLE II.—OBJECTS.

SEC. 1. This Association is established to promote the best interests of the Holstein-Friesian Cattle and their owners in the Dominion of Canada.

SEC. 2. To bring the breeders into close and friendly relations with each other that they may co-operate in their efforts to raise this noble race of cattle to a higher plane.

SEC. 3. To correct all erroneous statements regarding this breed of cattle, and protect the members from fraud or imposture in all matters pertaining to the purchase, sale or breeding thereof.

ARTICLE III.—OF MEMBERSHIP.

SEC. 1. Any person of good character, who is a citizen of North America, interested in the breeding of Holstein-Friesian Cattle, and the owner of such may apply for membership in this Association by filing a written or printed application, in such form as the Executive Committee may prescribe, with the Secretary, with the membership fee of five dollars, and undertaking to pay an annual due of one dollar. The form of application for membership shall give the applicant's name in full, his residence and post-office address, and such other particulars as the Executive Committee may require.

SEC. 2. If any objection is raised to a person becoming a member, his application for membership shall be submitted to the consideration of the Executive Committee, and if in their judgment the applicant is eligible for membership and ought to be admitted as a member of the Association and a two-thirds majority vote of the Executive Committee present to the effect is passed; or, if no objection is raised within ninety days of
