Had the Wanderers of Halifax won tonight it would have been a tie. The teams were so evenly matched in tonight's game that both halves were played without a score. A draw as well as a win would have given the championship to Amherst, therefore the Wanderers insisted on the observance of the rule which called for a continuance of play till one or other side scored. Five minutes after the resumption of play Curran shot the goal which gave the game to Amherst and captured for his club the championship of Nova Scotia.

One of the largest crowds of the season attended the big sports last evening at the Victoria Rink, over two thousand persons being present. The rink's band gave one of their choicest programmes.

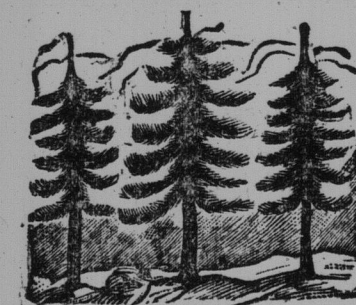

TARTE TALKS.

MONTREAL, Feb. 23.--R. L. Borden, the conservative leader, will arrive in Montreal on Saturday to confer with local conservatives.

Discussing the Monk incident, Mr. Tarte in La Patrie today has this to say: "I never have been in the way of Mr. Monk and have no ambition for his place. The whole thing is amusing. If I have differences with a group of his friends I have none with Mr. Monk. My role is simple. I am a protectionist and give my support when it is convenient to protectionist candidates. I do not have to ask anybody's permission to do that. Those who do not want me to have to say so. Incidents like the Monk affair have no weight on the politics of the country. Those who wish protection should not be disquieted by party quibbles. Mr. Borden has his political distinctions as well as Sir Wilfrid."
