With Captain, Mate and Fifteen of Her Crew.

Bark Andelina Swamped at Night by a Hurricane in the Harbor of Tacoma.

Captain Stalling Was a Resident of Annapolis and First Mate Crowe of Londonerry, N. S.—All Caught Like Rats in a Trap.

TACOMA, Wash., Jan. 14.—The British bark Andelina, 2,345 tons, of Nova Scotia, Captain G. W. Stalling, sank last night in 22 fathoms of water in front of the St. Paul mill wharf.

Two great boom logs were placed beside the Andelina, one on each side. During the gale, between two and four this morning, one of the logs went adrift, causing the ship to careen and to capsize, with very little warning.

The Andelina was built at Workington, North England, in 1888, and was owned by R. E. & W. Roberts of Liverpool, and was rated A1 by Lloyd's.
