



Freeport. Referring to the resignation of four of the pilot commissioners, Howard D. Troop, A. W. Adams, J. T. Knight, and Charles McLauchlan recently, one of the most prominent members of the board told the Standard yesterday that there was no friction of any kind that accounted for the matter. In the course of the conversation he said that he had no use for a compulsory pilotage law such as the present which ensured nothing but the payment of fees. There was nothing in the law he pointed out which sobliged the owner of a vessel to take a pilot, nor was there any provision which made it obligatory on pilots to be on the grounds where vessels might pick them up.
