Special Officer Will Patrol King Square and Old Burial Ground.

At yesterday's meeting of the Commissioners reperesentatives of the Loyalist Society were present and asked for the erection of a fence to preserve the historic memorials of the Old Burial Ground from depredation, a delegation of ten members of the New Brunswick Loyalist Society Interviewed the commissioners and filed a resolution recently adopted urging that some steps in this direction be taken.

It was finally decided to appoint a special officer to preserve order in the Burial Ground and King Square. It was pointed out that the Burial Ground was used as a resort for undesirable characters and that the gravestones were being defaced, broken and in some cases even removed. The suggestion was that an iron fence should be erected about the grounds, the main centre walk being kept, open and fenced along either side. Gates would be located at the entrances to the diagonal paths and these would be open during the daytime-but closed at night. The cost of such a fence would, it was pointed out, be between \$8,000 and \$10,000, and as no appropriation had been made for the purpose and there are no funds in view it was decided to abandon the project for the time being.
