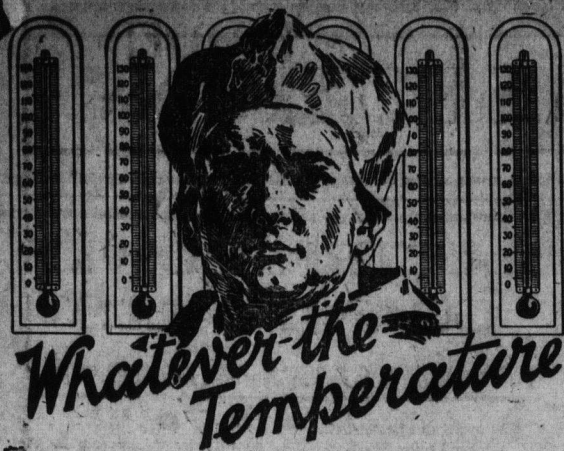

IN THE EDITOR'S MAIL

To the Editor of The Standard,
Dear Sir:—The result of the recent referendum in Alberta, Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Nova Scotia is a magnificent victory for prohibition. The people voted at a Dominion poll upon a Federal issue—the matter of inter-provincial traffic in intoxicating liquors. The result of this vote is that a degree of National Prohibition legislation is forthcoming from Ottawa.

This victory is a great stride towards a bone dry Canada. It is a further mandate from the electorate for a Dominion wide prohibition law.

The existence of large quantities of intoxicating liquor, the manufacture and importation of it elsewhere in Canada will continue to be a menace to these "dry" provinces.

The clamor call of the prohibition forces of Canada must now be "National Prohibition." Let the temperance people hold this ideal before them stronger than ever before and let them speak in one united voice. Let the new electorate, the women of Canada, recognize that they have in their hands at this moment the power which will finally deal the death blow to this traffic in Canada.

Our goal is a national law enacted by the Parliament of Canada, covering all incidents of traffic, applicable to the whole of Canada and defining intoxicating liquor as any beverage containing one half of one per cent alcohol.

MAY SHOW MOVIES IN ST. PAUL'S, LONDON

So far no decision has been reached but it is not thought that the cathedral will be used as a picture theatre without a spirited fight between the dignitaries of the church.
