Dissenting, or Denominational Schools, and the undersigned does not on examination find that any statute of the Province exists establishing such special Schools. A It may be that the Act in question may religious denominations, and if so, it is for vincial Legislature, which has power to grant redress. As, therefore, the Act applies to the whole school system of New Brunswick, and is not specially applicable to Denominational Schools, the Governor General has, in the opinion of the under signed, no right to interfere. As to the grants, those, of course, must be made annual, subject to the supervision of the Legislature, which has the sole power to deal with public funds, unless by special Those grants have been conferred fo special periods by Act of the Legislature. In such case the grant might be considered in the nature of a contract, and the repeal might be held to be a breach of that con-The undersigned does not find that any such statutory contract has been made. Under these circumstances he is therefore of opinion that no other course is open to the Governor General than to allow the Act to go into operation. It is thus admitted that the Legislatur of New Brunswick in no way exceed its powers as guaranteed by the Constitution, and the undersigned would further sub mit that as the power to enact exists in local bodies, the power to annul or amend body, should the measure be found on experience to be imperfect or oppressive in its operation.
