Three Men suffocated in a Burning Hoop Skirt and Corset Factory, Lime Kiln-A Sad Scene. ALLENTOWN, PA., May 7. A fearful casualty happened near Naza

reth, this county, on Monday evening Mr. Lichtenwallner owned a lime kiln about half a mile from that place. It had been burning for some days, but on the day mentioned was found to be choked. Mr. Lichtenwallner undertook to clear it. He was assisted by John Haldeman MACHINE OIL:
Lichtenwallner, taking a long iron rod, went to the top of the kiln, and forced it down into the lime. While leaning over the opening he was overcome by the sul-purous funes arising, and fell headlong into the kiln. His companion was for an instant stricken dumb with horror. Re-THE LOCKMAN. THE APPLETON. covering himself he sprang to the top of the kiln. Looking into the crater he saw

Mr. Lichtenwallner lying in the lime, struggling madly. Haldeman forgot in his anxiety the cause of Lichtenweilner's fate, and leaned far over the brink of the kiln, endeavoring to catch hold of him. He, too, was overcome by the poisonous gases and fell into the furnace.

Theo lore Walter was passing by, and saw Haldeman fall. He ran to the opening and quickly lowered a ladder into the kilr, and shouting loudly for assistance vent down where the men were lying They were not in the fire, but on the hot

Walter did not know that there were two men in the kiln. He seized the body of the first one he reached, that of Lichnwallner, and started up the ladde Before he was half way up, overcome by the poisoned air, he fell back unconscious with Lichtenwallner in his arms.

His cries had been heard, and several ersons hastened to rescue him, reaching the spot just as he fell back with Lichten He was taken out in a few ments, and the pure air soon restored him

The bodies of the other two were soon after raised, but every effort of physicians failed to restore them to life. The scene about the kiln when Lichten-wallner and Haldeman were brought out was a fearful one. They were both in-fluential men, and the heads of large

It is reported that the seals are now almost entirely kined off the South Shetland Islands. King told this man that he and his commades managed to live on pelican flesh and some biscuits left behind by a boat's crew, and made clothes of seal skins.

A hut was built of boards left there by another vessel, as was a stove, in which fire was kept with seal blubber. The survivor had been without fire for several days, and was somewhat benumbed when found.
