BOARD OF TRADE RESOLUTIONS.

SIR,—The undersigned and F. M.
Sproul, Esq., delegates from the King's County Board of Trade to the Fifth Arnsal Meeting of the Dominion Board of Trade, beg respectfully to refer to the following resolu ion unanimously adopted by the said Board of King's County at a general meeting held at the Count House, Hampton, K. C., on the 30th December last past, viz.:

"Whereas, the local rates of freight by the car load on the Intercolonial Railway are so high that the inhabitants of King's County are, in a great measure, deprived of the use of the road for the transportation of such car freight.

"And whereas, from the same cause, the traffic of the road must be materially SKATES

"Therefore resolved that the Dominion Government be memorialized to reduce the rates on freight by the car load as near as may be to the standard of the year 1873.

"And further resolved, that the delegates from the Board of Trade to the Dominion Board be hereby authorized and dracted to repartment of Puo is Works."

And, we would respectfully further submit the enclosed Petition and Memorial, with the request that you will grant such relief in the premises as may, under the peculiar circumstances of the case seem expedient.

The delegates would be glad to have a brief interview with the Hou. the Premier and Minister of Public Works, at such time as may be convenient.

The Petition of "The King's County Board of Trade," in the Province of New Brunswick, humbly sheweth,—

That, by the increase in the rate of freight by the car load recently made upon the Intercolonial Railway, great injury and loss accrue to the inhabitants of the counties along the said road.

That the present rate is actually prohibitory, preventing many from engaging in the various branches of industry upon which they were heretofore par i tily dependent for the means of subsistence.

That your petitioners sincerely believe that a reduction in said rate would be advantageous to the country, and, in confirmation thereof, beg leave most respectfully to submit the document herewith annexed.

Your petitioners, therefore, humbly pray that you be pleased to take such steps as will speedily reduce the said rate in such a manner as will prove beneficial, not only to the road, but also to the people.

FACTS ABOUT THE TARIFF—ITS INJUSTICE
AND ITS RUINOUS CHARACTER.

SIR.—We the Delegates appointed by
the King's County Board of Trade to pre
sent a Petition praying for a reduction
in the rate of freight by the car load upon
the Interccionial Railway, beg leave
most respectfully to ask your favorable
consideration of the following facts, and
in doing so we desire it to be distinctly
understood that this Delegation was not
appointed in a spirit of fault finding, but
with a desire to obtain if possible a more
equitable freight tariff upon said road
whereby the interests of the people, and
also of the road, will be greatly advanced.
With this object in view, we would
most respectfully submit as follows:—
1st. That the road has been construc
ted, equipped and maintained at the public expense, and with public money;
therefore, the public is entitled to all the
accommodation that can reasonably be
given, and at the lowest possible rates,
inasmuch as the people will be compelled to meet any deficiency when it arises.
2nd. That before the consolidation of
the lines of Railway in Nova Scotia and
New Brunswick, managed by the Do
minion Government, that portion of the
Intercolonial Railway whichextends from
St. John to Point du Chene had been controlled by the Dominion Government, and
had proved productive.

In support of this we would respect
folly refer to the reports of the Minister
of Public Works for the fiscal years ending June 30th, 1868, 1869 and 1870, where
it will appear:


