

the monies so received, a sum not exceeding five pounds per cent, as the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person having the administration of the Government of this Province for the time being, may direct; and provided also, that should the monies so received by the said Clerk of the Peace, under the provisions of this Act, be insufficient to pay the salaries of the said Justices of the Peace, and the disbursement of the expences by them so authorised, it shall and may be lawful for the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person having the administration of the Government of this Province for the time being, to order the payment of such deficiency by the Receiver General of the Province, out of such unappropriated monies as may be in his hands, and provided also, that at the end of each year, whatever surplus may remain in the hands of such Clerk of the Peace as aforesaid, shall be accounted for to the Governor, Lieutenant Governor, or person having the administration of the Government of this Province for the time being, and the same shall be paid over to the Receiver General of this Province.

XXII. And be it further enacted, by the authority aforesaid, that the due application of the sums of monies to be levied and paid, pursuant to the directions of this Act, shall be accounted for to his Majesty, his heir and successors through the Lords Commissioners of his Majesty's treasury, in such manner and form as his Majesty, his heirs and successors shall direct.

XXIII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that this act shall be and continue in force until the first day of January one thousand eight hundred and from thence to the end of the then next Session of the Provincial Parliament
