

The Honorable Mr. *Hamilton* (*Kingston*), from the Committee on Banking, Commerce and Railways to whom was referred the Bill intituled "An Act to amend the Act 23 *Victoria*, Chapter 123, being an Act incorporating the Corporation of Pilots for and below the Harbor of *Quebec*," reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and directed him to report the same, with several amendments which he was ready to submit whenever the House would be pleased to receive them.

Ordered, That the Report be now received, and
The said amendments were then read by the Clerk as follow :

Page 1, Line 20. Leave out "suits now pending" and insert "liabilities incurred before the passing of this Act."

P. 1, Line 25. After "Pilots" insert "and every such Pilot who shall refuse or neglect to pilot when so selected, shall be subject to the same penalty as that imposed by section thirty-three of the said Act, on pilots who refuse or neglect to pilot in their turn, and recoverable in the same manner."

The said amendments being read a second time, and the question of concurrence put on each, they were severally agreed to.

On motion of the Honorable Mr. *Mitchell*, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Campbell*, it was

Ordered, That the said Bill, as amended, be read a third time presently.

The said Bill, as amended, was then read a third time accordingly.

The question was put whether this Bill, as amended, shall pass?

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, with several amendments, to which they desire their concurrence.

The Order of the Day being read for the third reading of the Bill intituled "An Act respecting offences against the Person."

The Honorable Mr. *Campbell* moved, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Mitchell*,

That the said Bill be now read a third time.

After Debate,

The Honorable Mr. *Sanborn* moved in amendment, seconded by the Honorable Mr. *Tessier*,

To leave out "read a third time," and insert "referred back to a Committee of the Whole House with instructions to amend the same by striking out the clauses giving "discretionary power to the Judges to award punishment by whipping."

Which being also much debated,

The question of concurrence was put thereon, the House divided, and the names being called for they were taken down as follow :—
