

members of the Town Council in addition to the number of councillors of Town Councils now authorized by law.

14. In incorporated villages there shall be elected a Reeve and four Councillors, or if the village be entitled to a Deputy Reeve, then there shall be elected a Reeve, Deputy Reeve, and three Councillors, and the nomination and election of such Reeve and Councillors, or Reeve, Deputy Reeve, and Councillors, as the case may be, shall be conducted in the same manner as is now provided for the election of councillors in incorporated villages.

10 15. If a township is not divided into electoral divisions, the nomination of a Reeve and four Councillors, or a Reeve, a Deputy Reeve, and three Councillors, as the case may be, shall be conducted in the same way as is now provided for the election of councillors in townships not divided into wards.

15 16. All Acts or parts of Acts contrary to the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed.

17. This Act shall be read and taken as part of the said Act intitled, An Act respecting the Municipal Institutions of Upper Canada, chapter fifty-four of the Consolidated Statutes for Upper Canada.
