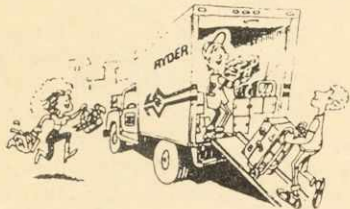
You may have visualized a male figure, but women aren't
