Dear Sir,-

I am writing you regarding The Farmers' Credit Act. The late Mr. A. M. Edwards was looking after it for me and after he passed away the Right Hon. R. B. Bennett, while he was leader, was looking after it. Afterward I wrote to Dr. Mannion and he wrote me a nice letter but said that as he did not have a seat in the House he could not do anything just yet.

I am a widow. My husband died five years ago with that dreadful disease cancer. Since that time I have carried on a small stationery business which we had at the time of my husband's death.

First I want to tell you about my Farm Mortgage. We had Eleven Thousand Five Hundred dollars on a farm mortgage on a farm in Oxford three miles from Norwich. The farm contains 175 acres and out of the Eleven Thousand Five Hundred we borrowed five thousand from the London Loan & Debenture Co., which we paid 7 per cent. After Mr. Goodwin's death I was able to pay half of it off which still leaves Two Thousand Dollars. I have never asked him for any on the Mortgage.
