 be no doubt that the possession  
 of the same by each head  
 of a family will give him  
 a greater sense of proprie-  
 -ship and will make him  
 more anxious to improve  
 his location, and at the  
 same time prevent en-  
 -croachment by other Indians  
 upon his land.
