PEACE. Therefore, individually, nationally, internationally, racially, in every form, and every walk of life, let all men try, for their own contentment (the greatest of all blessings) during the trying years to come, to co-operate with one aim:-

" TOTAL PEACE "

In continuing this plan of international post-war re-organization, it may be well to remember that the aggressor nations declared and carried out to the best of their ability -- TOTAL WAR. The only practical answer to TOTAL WAR and to prevent the possibility of a recurrence of such actions and times is to re-organize international affairs at the earliest possible moment on definite basic plans. Principles are not enough. The whole basis of future world peace must be based upon international co-operation. Any plan to succeed in maintaining world peace must be definite, simple in construction, equitable and just, both in spirit and action, without fear ar favour to any. It has been stated that "without Goodwill no organization can function" and "that with Goodwill no organization is necessary". Goodwill is necessary and very desirable, but reliance upon Goodwill will not do. It is necessary that there shall be a definite set of rules to keep in check any tendency to depart from goodwill through selfishness and greed. If there is enough goodwill, the opposition can be made to learn the value of and practice goodwill. We must not arrange only for the present but we must prepare also for the future.
