APRIL.—To destroy Canada thistles is a most important work, especially in some localities. They can be destroyed. A man of experience says,—"I plough them about six times during the summer—five times might do if a dry summer. I plough them the first time about the beginning of May, and so on near the first of every month till October. I always harrow them the next day after ploughing, which drags many to the surface. These must die. My rule is never to let them up Keep the air from the main root one summer, and they will die. I assure you I have proved it." Root out the thistles, and be assured it will pay better than to let them grow.
