THE CANADIAN NORTH-WEST

HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion and a Municiple on the Northwest Territories, excepting 8 and 28, which has not lost for settlers, or for other purposes, may be seen homestended, or reserved to provide word tots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be seen bead of a family, or any male over 18 years of age, to the extent of mequarter section of 198 arcs, more or less.

Entry may be made personally at the local land office for the District in which the land to be taken is situate, or if the homesteader desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Commissioner of Immigration, Winnipeg, or the Local Agent for the district in which the land is situate, receivo authority for some one to make entry for Λ fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected therewith, under one of the following plans:

At least six months' residence upon and cultivation of the land in each year during the term of three years.

(2) If the father (or mother, if the father is decased) or any person who is eligible to make a homestrad entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining patient may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

43) If a settler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for the issue of such patent countersigned in the state of the such patent countersigned in the state of the form a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the first homestead, if the second homestead is in the vicinity of the first.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon tarming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2)(3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acres of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acres substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homestead Inspector. Before making applica-tion for patent the settler must give six months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.

INFORMATION

Nextly arrived immigrants will receive at the Immigration Office in Wirmipeg, or at any Dominion Landa Office in Mirmipeg, or at the North-west Territories information as to the North-west Territories information as to the officers in charge, free of expense, advice and assistance in secturing lands to suit them.
