## THE THREE CORNERED PUZZLE

PREMIER ROBLIN IS OPPOSED TO DIRECT LEGISLATION; HE DESCRIBES IT AS "DEGENERATE REPUBLICANISM," AND DECLARES THAT HE WILL NEVER PUT IT ON THE STATUTE BOOKS. PREMIER SCOTT AND PREMIER SIFTON HAVE BOTH DECLARED THEIR FAITH IN DIRECT LEGISLATION AS A MEANS OF GIVING THE PEOPLE A VOICE IN THE MANAGEMENT OF THEIR OWN BUSINESS. PREMIER SIFTON PUT A DIRECT LEGISLATION ACT UPON THE STATUTE BOOKS, BUT IT IS SO FULL OF RESTRICTIONS AND "JOKERS" THAT IT IS ABSOLUTELY OF NO USE WHATEVER. PREMIER SCOTT PUT A DIRECT LEGISLATION BILL THRU THE LEGISLATURE. IT WAS A WEAK BILL OF VERY QUESTIONABLE VALUE. HE THEN PUT IT TO A REFERENDUM, WITH STIPULATIONS ATTACHED WHICH HE, AND EVERY ONE ELSE, KNEW WOULD KILL IT, AS ACTUALLY OCCURRED.
