Swept Away Enemy's Line.

The ground won in Monday's great battle gives evidence of the terrific effect of the artillery preparation on scale believed never before to have been attempted. The German tactics in withdrawing from the first line to their deep dugouts when the bombardment began, and leaving only their patrol exposed, is fully explained by the condition of the enemy's points. Our barrage and direct fire were so intense that the Germans sought to escape it by advancing. The number of their dead found well forward in the front lines in such positions, as indicate hand-to-hand fighting, and the utter sweeping away of their protective wire, which the enemy believed impregnable, must have had a most depressing effect on them.
