TO THE THRONE ASSURED BY FOUR STURDY LIVES.

The Present Reir Apparent is H.R. H. the Duke of Cornwall and York and If He Succeeds His Title Will Be George V. -Other Living Princes in the Direct

Four sturdy lives stand between His Majesty King Edward VII and a possible lapse in the succession of the house of Guelph to the British throne. It is a comfort to know that the dynasty, that now reigns in Great Britain is of a long lived and prolific stock. For two generations at least the succession in a straight line is assured, and it seems likely that the present royal family of the "tight little island" will long con-

tinue to reign. The present heir apparent to the British throne is George Frederick



DUKE OF CORNWALL AND YORK. Ernest Albert, Duke of Cornwall and York, who, when he assumes the reins of government, will be known as George V. He was born on June 3, 1865, at Marlborough House, the London residence of the former Prince of Wales

The Duke of Cornwall and York is not yet the Prince of Wales, and reference to him as such is somewhat premature. That title does not descend by right to the eldest son of the sovereign, but is conferred on him by royal patent. Edward VII was made Prince of Wales when he was 4 weeks old, and he will no doubt in the near future confer the same title on his son. The Duke of York is the second and only surviving son of His Majesty, the first having been the Duke of Clarence, who died in 1892.

At the time of the death of the Duke of Clarence he was affianced to Princess May of Teck, and soon thereafter rumor connected the names of the princess and Prince George. Queen Victoria heartily approved of the match, and the young couple were married on July 6, 1893. They have four children—three sons and a daughter—Prince Edward, Prince Albert, Princess Victoria and Prince Henry.

The Duke of York has been known as "the sailor prince" of England, for he was educated for the royal navy and has served in it for many He entered the navy with his older brother in 1877. He began as a cadet and advanced through all

S. Crescent.

LINLITHGOW PALACE.

Famous Ruin to Be Restored as Scotland' Memorial to the Late Queen of Great Britain.

In a speech at Edinburgh Lord Rosebery proposed that the Scottish memorial to Queen Victoria take the form of the restoration of Linlithgow palace, the most historic ruin in Scotland.

Linlithgow, the birthplace of Mary Stuart and the home of traditions 1300, when Edward I, of England or

his campaigns in Scotland erected a fortified camp on the site of the castle. The English occupied the fortification until 1307, when a Scotch peasant of the name of Bin-noch and seven followers of Bruce secured entrance by hiding them-selves in a load of hay which was allowed to pass uninspected into the castle. They captured the place and were rewarded by Bruce with rich

In the reign of Edward III. the castle was again in the hands of the English, and in 1424 it was partly destroyed by fire. After the suc cession of the Stuart family Linlithgow became a fixed royal residence and the Scottish kings were wont to deed it to their consorts. James IV. and his immediate successors improved and enlarged the castle, and with them it was the favorite residence. The degeneration began in 1746, when the castle was abandoned to the use of soldiers as a barracl

and was accidently set on fire.

The old ruin is all of polished stone and covers an acre of ground Many fine examples of sculpture and decorations are in a fair state of preservation, and a pile in the centre of the inner court is still tinguishable as a fountain. The par-liament chamber in which Mary Stuart first saw the light of day on December 8, 1542, is an object much interest to tourists.

THE .VELSH DRAGON.

Gallant Little Wales Desirons of Being Represented on the National Coinage

and the Royal Standard. Gallant little Wales as a municipality of the United Kingdom is very desirous, now that King Edward has ascended the throne, to be represent-ed on the Royal Standard and the National coinage, says Lloyd's. Scotland has its lion, Ireland its harp, and the Welsh peers and commoner who met at the House of Commons recently to consider the subject were unanimous in their decision that the Red Dragon would best typify Wales, and resolved to present a memorial to the King on the subject. The Welsh Red Dragon is a fearsomelooking beast, not unlike the Im-



perial Dragon of China, save that it has a sturdier aspect. It was a "supporter" of the Royal Arms from the time of Henry VII. till the end of the reign of Queen Elizabeth, and was shown on a white and green ground, the colors in the House of Tudor. The color of the dragon is bright red shaded to gold, and it has a Royal blue tongue surrounded with lambent flames. Henry VII. adopted the Red Dragon for the device of his standard at the battle of Bosworth Field. It was the ensign of Cadwallader, the last of the British Kings from whom the Tudors descended. Our sketch is from the old heraldic devices in which the Red Dragon appears as "supporter."

THE OLDEST FAMILY. The Line of China's Greatest Philosophe

the Most Ancient. Confucius, the founder of the Confucian religion of China, lived 551 to 478 B. C. He was contemporary with the Tarquins of Rome, Pythagoras of Greece, and Cyrus of Per sia. His descendants form the aris tocracy of China and have always enjoyed high privileges. There are still some forty thousand of them seventy generations removed from their ancestor; this being the oldest family in the world. There are sixteen hundred and sixty temples erect ed to the memory of Confucius, or Kung-Fu-Tsee, in China, the largest covering ten acres of land. He is the patron saint of that vast empire; and the doctrine he promulgated forms the State religion of the nation, sustained by the whole powbody. Yet it is a religion without priests of liturgy. Morality and re-

verence are its chief characteristics. Reverence for parents, or the aged. was as imperative in his teaching as for the Diety; and golden rule in its negative form is found in his writings. "Do not unto others what you would not have them do unto you." The religion of Confucius is an ethnic religion, or one confined with the boundaries of a particular race or family of mankind. It belongs to China and the Chinese. It has been their State religion for some twenty-three hundred years, and it rules the opinions of four hundred millions of men.
