Cemetery Meeting.
The sixteenth annual meeting of the Willow Bank Cemetery Association was held on Wednesday afternoon in the rooms of the Wolfville Fire Co. The attendance as usual was small. The reports of the secretary and treasurer were read and adopted. During the past year 6 lots have been sold, the total number sold now being 80. There were 16 interments during the year—making the total number since the cemetery was opened 161. The treasurer's report showed a balance on hand of \$107.59, with \$222.52 due cemetery. The retiring trustees, viz., Messrs G. V. Rand, C. H. Burden, and Burpee Witter were re-elected. The officers were also re-elected: President, J. W. Caldwell; Vice President, G. V. Rand; Secretary, A. J. Woodman; Treasurer, C. H. Borden.

Discussion was entered into in consideration of applying to Parliament for permission to close the cemetery against the public, when the following resolution was adopted: That a committee be appointed to apply to Parliament asking for power to close the cemetery against the public as a thoroughfare. The following were appointed a committee to carry out the above resolution: J. W. Caldwell, Prof. Keirstead, J. W. Caldwell, J. W. Woodman, J. W. Wallace, G. V. Rand.

A. J. Woodman, J. W. Caldwell and S. P. Benjamin were appointed a committee to look up a man suitable to be engaged as a care taker, to be hired permanently for a few months each summer.
