

BRITISH POLITICS.

No New Developments.

LONDON, Dec. 29.—Lord Randolph Churchill is in Ireland. It is thought his business is for the purpose of obtaining information bearing on the Irish question to be used at a Cabinet Council to be held shortly.

The Telegraph, commenting to-day on the question of Home Rule for Ireland, says: "The Government will resist to its utmost ability any scheme giving to the Parliament control of the Police force in Ireland."

Right Hon. Wm. E. Forster, Liberal member of Parliament for Bradford, who has been ill for some time, has had a serious relapse. It is now feared that Mr Forster will not recover.

Capl. O'Connell has requested the Mail to contradict the statement published by that paper yesterday to the effect that he had been arranging an understanding between the Fenellites and Mr Gladstone.

It is reported that Mr Gladstone has despatched a local government measure before revealing his own scheme. He is much irritated by the cool reception given the published account of his project by the Liberals, and privately declares that he will never again accept office.

A Typical American Youngster.

PASS, Dec. 20.—In the case of the four Newark children who are under treatment by M. Pasteur, things are not going with all the smoothness that could be desired. Dr. Billings has removed three of the lads from their lodgings, near Pasteur's laboratory, to his own hotel, where he can better watch their symptoms. He has also engaged a stout German woman to take charge of them, not because there is any danger, but only a vexatious necessity to keep them from running in the streets, especially Fatsy Reynolds, who is the most unruly one of the lot. The main trouble has been caused by Mrs. Ryan, who is acting badly. She refused to go with the boys to Dr. Billings' hotel and although she is daily expecting to be confined she refused to go to the hospital or part with her son. She also demands money for her services. The Ryan boy in the laboratory screams and howls and makes a great deal of trouble. It requires force to make him submit to the operation of inoculation. The others behave well and are in good health. They all complain, however, that the hypodermic syringe hurts them.

Burma and the Sudan.

LONDON, Dec. 29.—The Government has instructed Gen. Stephenson, commander of the troops in Egypt, to limit his operations to clearing the country between Wady Halfa and Koussoko of rebels. The Government desires to meet Parliament looking to the re-conquest of the Sudan. Negotiations are proceeding with China for a rearrangement of the boundary between China and Burma. England is willing to concede to China a strip of territory approaching Bhamo, on condition that it will be protected by police, and that China adopts lower tariffs.

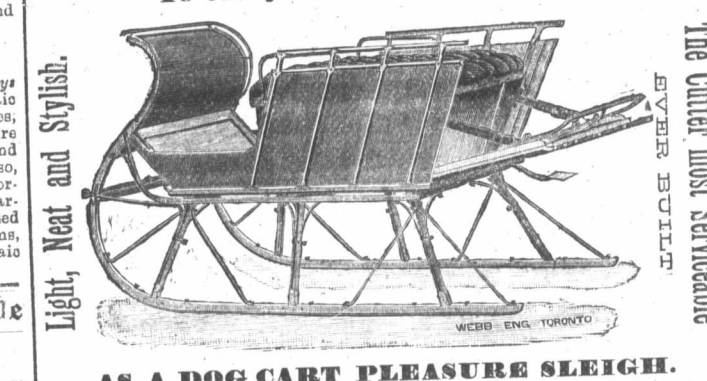

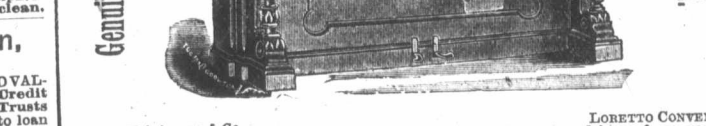
