Some sixty or eighty persons attended a meeting at Carlow under the auspices of the Cobourg Equal Rights Association Friday evening last, which was advertised to be addressed by Rev. John Young, of Drummondville.

The chair was occupied by Mr. Alex. Robertson, one of the prominent agitators in the section on behalf of Equal Rights, who called upon Rev. Mr. Young to open with prayer.
