### The Olive's Report.

When the Olive which arrived from Labrador with lumber yesterday, called at Black Tickle and Batteau going north and coming this way, went into Hawke's Harbor, the banker, Loch Lomond, Capt. Nurse, of Bay du Nord, had reached there the day before and made a good start fishing. She reports 70 or 80 schooners coming south with her, some of them with fares ranging from 300 to 600 qts. The Fogo, of Fogo, had 600 qts.; Larkspur, of Greenspond, 500; Capt. S. Bages two vessels had 600 qts. each. They had been fishing near King's Bay. As the vessel passed Elliston, T.B., a fleet of boats were doing well with the fish.

## Cable News.

Special Evening Telegram.

BERLIN, Sept. 7. The French Ambassador visited the Foreign Office this afternoon and received the draft of the German counter proposals to the revised proposals submitted by France regarding the Morocco dispute. Officials of the Foreign Office have hopes that the counter-proposals will be the means of promoting a settlement. The Government are keeping the draft secret and have asked France to do the same. The counter proposals, it is believed, do not imply the rejection of any of the French suggestions, but indicate the acceptance of some of them and the modification of others.

Special Evening Telegram.

BOSTON, Sept. 7. The lives of many missionaries are believed to be endangered by rioters at Chengtu, in the opinion of officials of the American Baptist Foreign Missionary Society. To-day a cablegram was received which said, "The American consular desires us to leave." To-day's message convinced the officers here that the situation had reached an acute stage, and the lives of the missionaries and the mission property are in danger.

Special Evening Telegram.

PEKING, Sept. 7. Missionaries in the outlying districts of the Szechuen province have been ordered to concentrate in the larger towns in consequence of general unrest among the natives, arising from the Government's railroad policy. All foreigners in Chengtu (the capital of the Szechuen province) are taking refuge in the compound of the Missionary Society of the Methodist Church of Canada.

### Here, There and Everywhere

To swim from Liverpool to Boston is the desire of Dr. Denner, who is known as the world's champion long distance swimmer. The day set down to start is Feb. 13, 1912. Two hundred days will be required in which to complete the performance; the swim will be continuous, but not sustained effort; the doctor will be accompanied by a barque manned by 18 men and a life boat and a physician will form part of the equipment. Denner is 38 years old and an Australian. He has lived in the water since he was 8 years old.

Tom Longboat, the great Indian runner, a short time since won a great race in Toronto. The course was twelve miles, and Longboat was opposed by A. Shrubbs and W. Woods (a former English champion), while several other runners also took part. Longboat won in 1:02:32 3-5, beating Woods by six inches. The event was witnessed by 7,000 people, and Longboat received a great ovation at the finish.

Capt. C. Williamson, a Scotman will begin operations on the Virginian Coast to recover treasure to the value of \$2,000,000. He will use an iron tube plunging three hundred feet below the surface of the water.

A bag of mail lost overboard at Plymouth from a steamer, has been recently picked up at Falmouth, having drifted over 50 miles.

The biggest warship in the world built for the Argentine Republic, was recently launched at Quincy, Mass. It is of 28,000 tons.

Several degrees of frost have been reported from Manitoba and the crops have suffered in consequence.

Great Britain has three million horses over four years old that can carry harness or saddle.

British securities show a shrinkage owing to recent labor troubles, of over \$365,000,000.

The world's gold output last year was \$94,125,635.

### The Bonavista Branch.

There are now about 250 men at work on the Bonavista branch railway and most of these were engaged ballasting the road or loading timber. The work is finished to a point three miles west of Catalina and will be opened for traffic one month hence. The station being erected at Bonavista will be the second largest in the Colony, will be nicely furnished and will be one of the most imposing buildings in Bonavista.
