Khutukhta is s ecclesiastic subordinate to the Dala Lama, head of the Lamaism religion a corrupt form of Buddhism. His relations with the Dalai Lama are about the same as those of Cardinal to the Pope. The Rech, in a significant article this morning recounts the re cent Mongolian outbreaks, and states that the election of Khutukhta by Mongolia means the end of the de pendency by Mongolia, and the end of the Manchu dynasty. It concludes "We have already pointed out that to some degree such a course of events answers the interests of Russia. We repeat now that not appeaation nor grab, but protection of the independence and autonomy of Mongolia should be the aim of Russian diplomacy."
