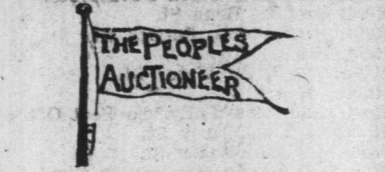

Public Notice Regarding Coal.

I am instructed by the Tonnage Committee of the Executive Council to place before the General Public the soft coal situation at the present time and to ask all who are able to do so to co-operate with them in securing sufficient stocks. Coaling steamers are now available, but will not be available later on. Therefore, it is necessary to stock within the period that they are available sufficient coal to carry St. John's over the Winter till the opening of navigation next year.

The Coal Merchants have not sufficient storage capacity to enable this to be done, and the Tonnage Committee appeal to the public to assist in the matter by laying in their Winter supplies as soon as possible.
