all our berths having been allotted.

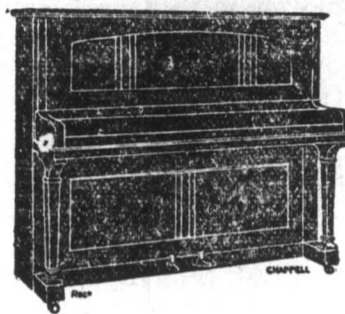
Any person recently recovered from Spanish Influenza

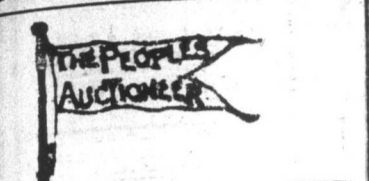
